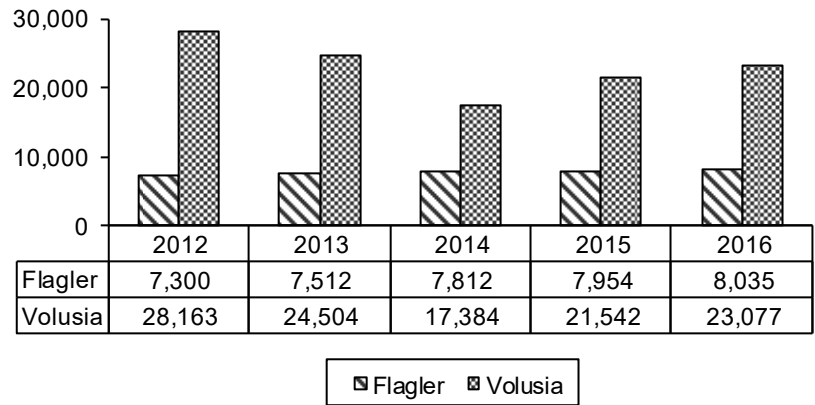


# Transportation

Access to transportation and mobility is essential and, sometimes, even critical. Public transportation is important to all of us and, for some, the only option available. Consequently, health and human service professionals need to be equipped to assist clients and individuals seeking transportation. Issues related to mobility cross all generations and abilities. Included here is a snapshot of transportation utilization in Flagler and Volusia Counties.

## SERVING THE TRANSPORTATION DISADVANTAGED

Public transportation for the Transportation Disadvantaged is provided by *Flagler County Public Transportation* in Flagler County and *Votran* in Volusia County. *Votran* offers Gold Service (door-to-door) for non-Medicaid individuals and all “fixed route” buses are fully accessible. Multiple health-related organizations provide non-emergency transportation to Volusia County Medicaid-eligible residents.

In 2016, Flagler saw an increase in passenger trips of 1.0% and Volusia saw an increase of 7.1%. Flagler had its largest increase of 17.5% in Medical trips with the largest decrease of -6.8% in Education/Training/Adult Daycare trips. Volusia’s largest increase was 10.9% for Nutritional trips with the largest decrease, 1.0%, for Medical trips.
